

AN INSPIRING JOURNEY: FROM PASSION TO PROFESSION





LUCAS ALVAREZ LA6 FOUNDATION: EMPOWERING THE NEXT GENERATION OF SKILLED WORKERS

The Lucas Alvarez LA6 Foundation is a non-profit organization committed to providing scholarships and supporting underprivileged young adults in Miami-Dade County, while helping them attend a technical (vocational) trade school, where they can pursue rewarding careers. Founded in memory of Lucas Alvarez, who tragically passed away in a boating accident at a young age of 18, the foundation honors his passion for mechanics and dedication to helping others.

Since established in June 2020, the foundation has provided financial assistance for tuition, books, uniforms, and even computers, when necessary, for students to pursue a career in fields like automotive, HVAC, electrical, plumbing, welding, or even to pursue a degree. The foundation's focus is on helping local students, with one of the first recipients being Ramiro Romero, a graduate of Miami High who attended Miami Lakes Technical College and was hired by Bonin Chevrolet, Homestead. In addition, the foundation has helped former graduates such as Kevin Vargas who is gainfully employed by Aventura Honda, and Lucas Moncada who is currently employed by AutoNation of Miami.

As of June 2024, the LA6 Foundation has supported over 20 of Miami-Dade County Public Schools Technical College students, empowering them to pursue careers in the automotive and trades industry. By identifying young adults with talent, passion, and drive, the foundation continues to change lives and honor Lucas' legacy. According to some of our automotive instructors, this scholarship program has been a true blessing to our district and of course our students.


